March 14 UMCOR Sunday April 4 Easter - Shared Giving

From Pastor Dylan:

The Easter message is the core belief of our faith. God came to this world, lived among us, and went through frustration, failure, suffering, pain, and death just like all of us. Jesus' death on the cross is a sign of love that God is willing to suffer and die for us. God is saying to us, "I will give my life for you to save you. This is the kind of love I have for you." Just like we parents are willing to sacrifice anything for our children, even to give our lives for them. And through the resurrection, we see that there is nothing that can separate us from the love of God, not even death can take us from God.

This is the message I am craving now, more so than at any other time. I want to spread this message of resurrection – that God's love overcomes all human brokenness and failure. I am weary of this long pandemic and am counting on the day that everyone can gather together and do what we used to do. I am fed up with racial injustice issues and the feeling that there is no way to make peace with one another. I am tired of watching partisanship among people over different opinions, perspectives, understandings, and so on. I wish somehow God would fix everything and make things better; and that somehow, miraculously, people would understand that only love can mend everything. Yet, God is reminding us that we are the agents of God's love in this world, called to embody and show people how to love, embrace, share & care, forgive, and empower each other.

Yes, we live in a world with suffering, darkness, and brokenness; unexpected/unwanted things happen to all of us. And God is with us in the midst of all of this mess, just like Christ was here with us and went through all of our human sufferings and limitations, even to death. I believe God is with us. God is walking with us, God is suffering with us, and God understands what we are going through.

And I pray that God will transform our suffering, darkness, and brokenness into hope, light, and love — just like the message of resurrection.
