Financial report from Mark Oldenkamp: End of budget year, start of a new one:

We did it. 2020 is in the books and will rise in conversations for decades to come. DO you remember what happened in "2020"?

At Canby United Methodist Church we will remember this for the significance of our planned transition to being served by a 1/2 pastor as we said goodbye to Pastor Karen in the midst of COVID and struggled to welcome Pastor Dylan in the midst of COVID. Through it all we should be proud that we managed to find ways to stay connected as a community of faith. I am so glad that the preschool was able to find a way to start their program in the fall.

The lack of an in person worship experience made things more difficult. This impacted our ministry and had the expected impact on our income. Despite this and with the help of our PPP loan/grant we made it to 2021. At the end of the year we gave \$6,000 toward apportionments and conference requests. While this is far short of the total allocation, it was very positive to be able to do this much. Thank you to all that continue to support our ministry.

Our 2021 budget has been approved and is about \$30,000 lower than 2020. We are still impacted by COVID, although there is more hope largely because of the vaccine that is more real now. We have a plan in place to offer an in person worship experience starting soon, with some important protocols we must observe. We did not have a formal pledge drive in 2020 for 2021. I hope that you have given some thought to the ministry here and will prayerfully consider your regular giving in 2021. It is customary for us to encourage a step up in your pledge. If you are able this would be very helpful.

I am poised to seek a second PPP loan/grant for our church in 2021. I am just waiting for our bank to confirm the rules and we will be right on top of the situation to increase our chances to be included.

Recycling update:

While we are a small group it amazes me how successful this program is for us. I just requested another \$500 check that is on its way to us for the recycling fund. In December, this fund was used to purchase some backpacks for that ministry which helped many people in December. Thanks to all that support that effort and to Ken and Deanna for their commitment to this ministry.

Our participation in the 2020 Holiday Give Promotion garnered us a bonus of \$64.22 I had almost 30 full blue bags saved to turn when this promotional window started; several full car loads. YOU kept bringing them and I got everything I could dropped off before the ending date. We redeemed over \$2,000 in 2020!! NICE JOB! Keep them coming.! Just leave them at the church or let us know If we can help by swinging by to pick them up. Don't forget to drop in on your neighbors and see if they will give you their redeemable cans and bottles. This is a very good way to practice environmental stewardship and to give our church a little for needs not anticipated
