Last month I took a vacation that was long overdue. I spent time with my family away from work and my very busy schedule, and we spent a couple of days at a cabin on Mt. Hood. During this time away, I took time to walk alone in the woods, to sit still while I watched the streams of water. Other times I walked with my five-year-old son and followed his lead. I realized how much I have been pushing myself to get things done and how I fail to be attentive to my inner need to rest.

In this time of the unique circumstances of the pandemic, I have talked with many people who are challenged and overwhelmed because of the impact this pandemic is having on all of us in various ways. Many of us are isolated for long periods of time. Many of us struggle with depression. Many of us are challenged with a variety of health concerns. Many of us are bombarded with social justice issues. And many people are struggling with financial difficulties. With all of these serious issues, it is not easy to find peace in my heart

A couple of weeks ago, we studied the Sacred Pathways. I reminded myself that taking time to be in solitude is essential for my spiritual well-being. I can connect with God when I am apart from daily matters; I listen to God when I meditate and sit still. I need to intentionally remember to be attentive to this monastic part of me and to accept that spending time apart is very important for my wellness. I also remember that I need to deliberately schedule my time to go for a walk, time to be in the church sanctuary, and time to drive alone occasionally. This time for solitude is an important tool I need to recharge myself.

Friends, you are in my heart, I am praying for all of you; I am with you in this time. Remember to take time to connect with God. I want you to be intentional about setting aside time for yourself away from your daily routine. We need to connect with God and find the peace that comes from the Spirit.
